## **MEMBER'S PROFILE**

## The Jenny Hashim-Jones' story

I am second generation of Indian descent, born in Mombasa, a coastal town in Kenya, East Africa. Both my paternal and maternal grand-parents migrated from India as free settlers, when Kenya was colonised by the British. The British built the East African Railways for economic purposes. They imported lots of Indian labourers (coolies), who helped them build the railway in the late 19th century. These people became the backbone of the economy in Kenya; this included my grand-parents as well.

I went to England in 1962 to acquire a degree in Nursing where I also studied Midwifery and other courses pertaining to this degree. I worked in cancer research centre, plastic surgery, casualty and in many other nursing facets whilst there.

I returned to Kenya in 1969 after spending seven years in various UK hospitals gaining experiences in general nursing. In Kenya I worked as resident school matron in a boarding school, in the country side, looking after health and well-being of 1200 students aged between 6 and 16. At the school I also taught Anatomy and Physiology. I also worked in various hospitals in Nairobi, Kenya.

My other job was to visit rural, African communities, as a volunteer, to advise them on health and nutritional issues as well as birth control.

I met Allen through correspondence, actually he was a coin collector and so was my father. During our exchange of letters, I sent him many coins from all parts of the world, and told him about my life in Kenya. Well, during this time we fell in love and he asked me to marry him.

I came to Australia in 1972 and joined in matrimony and never looked back. My life in Australia has been a bliss, have two sons and four grand-children.

I worked with Qld Corrective Services, prisons, both men's and women's. It was the best job I'd ever had. I met offenders from all walks of life including blue and white collar crimes; eg. Politicians, Doctors, Union Officials, Lawyers, Policemen, etc. and hard-core criminals. My work with all of the above was very trying and one has to be totally impartial and non-judgmental to work in this field. I also worked at The Park Centre for Mental Health in Wacol to improve my psychiatric abilities to enable me to help offenders with mental health issues.

In 2010 I retired after many years fulfilling my very interesting profession. My husband and I are now enjoying our retirement and awfully glad to have joined the National Seniors and all the activities it has to offer by some very dedicated committee members and I thank them all.
