Kier Tierney, the NBN Community Ambassador, gave us some scary statistics during his talk on scam awareness. The amount of money lost to **NBN scams alone** has increased from \$900,000 in 2019, to \$1m in 2020, and \$1.5 m in 2021 (just Jan-Sep)!

However, investment scams cost more than \$28m for those over 65 alone, in 2021.

Become ScamFit - top tips

- 1. NBN will never call and ask to access your computer or advise you are going to be disconnected.
- 2. Never give out bank details or credit card numbers to a caller over the phone
- 3. Secure your personal devices with PIN code or password
- 4. Make your passwords as long as possible and different for each site
- 5. Be mind-full of what you share on social media

If you think you've given your details to a scammer

Contact your bank or financial institution straight away Report it to Scamwatch – www.scamwatch.gov.au/report-a -scam Contact IDCARE on 1300 432 273 if you think you've given the scammer remote access to your computer or device.
