MEMBER PROFILE: DAVID PORT

I was adopted into the Port family by Hazel & Roland (Snowy) Port when about 1 year old. When they first saw me they thought I was a bit of a show off and cheeky. I remember living in Aunty Bren's house in Holland Park. Aunty Bren was not a true aunty but a close friend of Mum. During World War II I watched troop movements at the Army Base across Logan Road from the verandah. Aunty Bren looked after me while mum worked. Mum and Dad rented a home in Preston Road Manly, opposite the reservoir where we lived for several years. My sister, Sandra, was born on 25 April 1944.

I went to kindergarten for a short period before starting primary school at Manly State School in 1945. A section of the school ground had been excavated for slit trenches where students and teachers had to go if there was an air raid. I completed Prep and Grade 1 to 4 at Manly. Then Grade 5 and 6 at Wynnum North State School where I helped set up the school projector for education movies. This experience came in handy a few years later. I also set up the shadow board and read the sun's shadow at 1pm each day. This board was 2 pieces of timber, 200mm wide, nailed together, height 300mm, base length 600mm. The shadow case by the 300mm high section was what we recorded. This shadow showed the longest and shortest days of the year. This was part of our studies of weather patterns.

During the first 12mths at Wynnum North we lived in a tent (5m x 5m) and all we owned was in the tent. The tent was set up so that when it rained we lifted the centre pole off the block and on to the ground to loosen the ropes.

Before we moved to Wynnum North I had joined the Scout Movement in 1948 as a Wolf Club at Manly Lota Scout Group. The Scout Den (an old air raid shelter) was located in Ferguson St. The building is still there and another level is on top of the concrete roof. This was the start of my 12 years in scouting, resigning as an Assistant Cub Leader in 1959.

I went crabbing with Dad when I was about 11yrs old. He caught sand crabs by hand lines, dillies and nets. I was amazed at how turtles used to destroy nets when eating the sand crabs. Dad caught crabs in many different ways and showed me all the ways to find crabs and get them out of the holes. During this time we never had to purchase seafood as Dad caught it for us i.e. crabs in summer and fish during winter.


Before I went to Intermediate School (Gr 7 & 8) at the Wynnum State High & Intermediate School, I got a part-time job delivering ice for about 2 years getting up at 4am - 3 mornings a week, I earned 30 shillings a week – about \$3.50 today.

Dad then got a construction job at Tangalooma Whaling Station. We would go to Tangalooma once a month on the service boat – The Norman R Wright. I thought I was special when able to steer the boat across the bay. On completion of the whaling station, Dad was then employed during the whaling season to work on the flenseing deck helping the flensers. I knew my way around the factory and took home lots of samples. I gave lectures to my classmates on topics including whale products being used for cattle food, fertiliser and cosmetics.

I finished school in December 1953 at Wynnum passing Scholarship Exam with 71.6% and Intermediate Exam with 77.6% which allowed me to progress to Gr9.

Having left school I wanted to be a boat builder but could'nt get an apprenticeship. I worked for my Uncle Ray on his fruit run for about 4mths. As I could not get a boat builder apprenticeship I applied to be an apprentice carpenter and started working for Battle & Lee, Builders. In May 1954 I was sent to work at Carina on Housing Commission Homes. After 3 mths I transferred to another QHC job at Manly closer to home. I went to Central Technical College for the theory side of my apprenticeship 1 night a week and I afternoon for practical work. During my 4th year Battle & Lee split up and I completed my apprenticeship with Harry Lee in December 1959.

Dear Community Friends

Contrary to some rumours doing the rounds, Jindalee Bowls Club is still standing! Bowlers are enjoying the beautiful winter sunshine and using the refurbished bbq area in lieu of a clubhouse.

Current situation is, that in consultation with BCC, following detailed examination of the building, the southern section closest to the golf course where the pool table, coffee station and office were located is to be demolished as that slab has moved. It was the last section to be built, some years after the original building and the hall.

Architects are in the process of redesigning the smaller bar area. Several scenarios have been discussed.

The hall and the foyer are to be restored. No floor coverings will be laid - rather the concrete cleaned and polished and a nonslip coating applied. All plasterboard has been removed. Brick walls will be painted/rendered. No time frame has been mentioned but we have every expectation of being back in business at the beginning of 2023 and we look forward to welcoming you back to the revitalized facility.
