#### **QUICK QUICHE**

4 eggs

½ diced onion

1 tbsp. chopped parsley

2 bacon rashers

½ cup S.R Flour

1 ½ cups milk

Salt and Pepper

Mix all in a bowl & bake for 40 minutes in moderate oven

#### WHOLEMEAL SCONES

1 cup SR Flour Wholemeal Flour 1 cup SR Flour White Flour 1 ½ tbsps. polyunsaturated margarine 180ml-200ml half strength skim milk

Mix flours in mixing bowl. Fold in margarine lightly

with fingertips until it resembles fine breadcrumbs.

Mix in sufficient milk to make a soft dough. Put dough onto lightly floured board and roll out

To 1.5cm thickness. Cut into rounds and place on an oiled baking tray. Cook in hot oven 12-15 minutes.

On July 8<sup>th</sup> NSA members gathered in the cafe area of Fairbridge Village where they enjoyed scones jam and cream with either coffee or tea and chatted with other members and friends.





The day was bright and welcoming as everyone walked up to the church. Inside the group began to take their seats in the spacious well-kept church ready for a talk by Audrey who at one time taught at the village.

### **Happy Snaps**

Audrey gave us an interesting talk about the creation of Fairbridge Village and its life. Built as a boy's home where during and after the war, children from England, who were mostly orphaned, were housed, schooled and taught various trades. It seems that although the concept of the lifestyle of the boys





was to equip them for adult life many boys perceived it negatively.

Later things changed and it became a boarding school housing both boys and girls. Some of the students resenting the fact that their parents lived in Perth while sending their children to Fairbridge. Others thrived on being there and many still attend reunion weekends at the Village.

### **Happy Snaps**

The group then visited the museum where uniforms, utensils and tools are displayed alongside information on the history of Fairbridge Village.





We enjoyed a tasty lunch in the museum building in front of a roaring fire, enjoying chatting about the day and the pros and cons of the boys' lives in the Village.

Interestingly a few days later I found myself talking with a man

who said he grew up in Fairbridge Village. He said his Father had died in the war and in 1952 his mother decided to remarry and sent him to Fairbridge. He spoke about the journey to Australia how unhappy, confused and abandoned he felt. On reaching Fairbridge the culture shock, weather and way of life completely overwhelmed him resulting in a miserable and confusing childhood. He went on to say that in two weeks' time he was traveling to England under a Government reunifying scheme to meet his two half-sisters for the first time
