A Seniors Forum was held on Friday 4th April in the Brighton Rugby Union Football Clubrooms.

Approximately 145 people attended the forum which was hosted by Sarah Andrews, State Member for Gibson.

After Sarah welcomed the attendees, she introduced Kathy Williams from the Office of Ageing Well, a state government organisation which works to fulfil the government's commitment to supporting South Australians to age well. Through continued consultation with a diverse range of older South Australians and by partnering with government, non-government and community organisations the Office for Ageing Well supports older people to remain active and engaged.

The organisation works with and for older South Australians through the:

- Seniors Card Program
- Retirement Villages Unit
- Aged Care Assessment Program
- State Ageing Plan
- Community Grants

The Office for Ageing Well has also expanded its existing support function for adult safeguarding through the work of the Adult Safeguarding Unit.

After Kathy spoke, there was a chance for questions and answers.

Sarah then introduced the State Premier, Peter Malinauskas, who spoke on a range of subjects. There was once again time for questions and answers.

Afterwards, attendees had time to browse the many information stalls which were set up and receive information on a wide variety of subjects available. National Seniors Brighton Branch being one.

Tea, coffee and light refreshments were provided, and it was agreed by all to have been a very successful morning.

In 2024, *Change.org* held **Cash Out Day** which was a major success, with ATM companies and banks noticing a big spike in the numbers of withdrawals.

Since then, Australia's extremely profitable banks have committed to keep bank branches open (for a few years) and the government has committed to a cash mandate from 1 January.

This year the Cash Out Day is on Tuesday 22nd April. So if you're able, withdraw some cash.
