KING ISLAND ITINERARIES

TOUR 1:

4 days/3 nights - "THE KING ISLAND EXPERIENCE" - 11 - 14 October 2021.

4WD Guided Experience. Minimum of 6x, maximum of 22x persons per tour. Cost is between \$1750 and \$1794/pp. Includes Flights, Accommodation, 3 Dinners, 3 Lunches, 3 Morning Teas, Continental Breakfasts. First meal - Lunch on Day 1. Bonus: For our group there will be a special 5-course Degustation Dinner of King Island produce. There will also be another meal of half a Lobster.

Single supplement - \$240 at King Island Wilderness Retreat, or one person can share a guest house and have separate bedroom at no extra charge.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: A NON-REFUNDABLE DEPOSIT OF \$400.00/PP IS REQUIRED BY THE <u>APRIL</u> MEETING. Money can be given to Lorraine Oaten or we will accept a transfer to the branch bank account - BSB633000 A/c 120893615. In the reference line please type your Surname and KI so that we can identify what the payment represents. Balance of payment required 1 month prior to departure. Travel Insurance is recommended if you cancel due to illness. If the trip is cancelled due to CoVID restrictions money will be refunded.

TOUR 2:

2 days/1 night - "GOURMET FOOD WEEKEND" - 9 - 10 October 2021.

4WD Guided Experience. Minimum of 6x, maximum of 22x persons per tour. Cost between \$1198/pp. Includes Flights, Accommodation, Dinners, Lunches, Morning Teas and Continental Breakfasts. First meal - Breakfast on Day 1. One Dinner will be a "Highlight Hands On (help prepare the meal) 5-course Degustation" of King Island produce. There will also be another meal of a Lobster Roll.

Single supplement - \$80 at King Island Wilderness Retreat, or one person can share a guest house and have separate bedroom at no extra charge.

Accommodation: There is limited accommodation in 4 guest houses which gives you the opportunity to share with another couple or two. Guest house accommodation has been recently renovated with double glazed windows.

The owners, Lucinda & Ian, will collect guests from their accommodation each day and transport them for meals and sightseeing. Meals are in the restaurant or 'white table service' in the bush which is such a treat! Apart from drinks, everything is included. Wine is included with the bush meals though.

A highlight of these tours are the 4-wheel drive vehicles that give us access to parts of the island where otherwise we could not go.

Note: We are booking the "4 days/3 nights King Island Experience" again as it was such a success last time. (We had 2 groups go in November 2015.) The "Gourmet Food Weekend" is a recent tour addition as the tour operators have built a new restaurant. This restaurant has been voted No. 1 on King Island and will be used for both trips.
