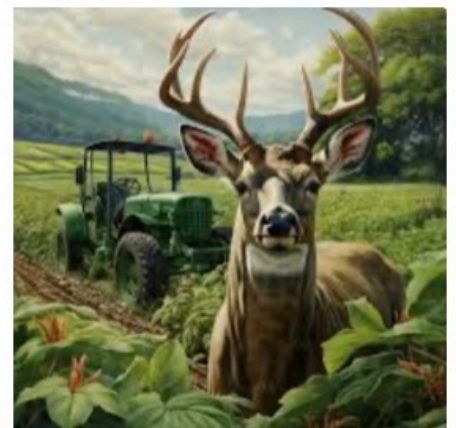
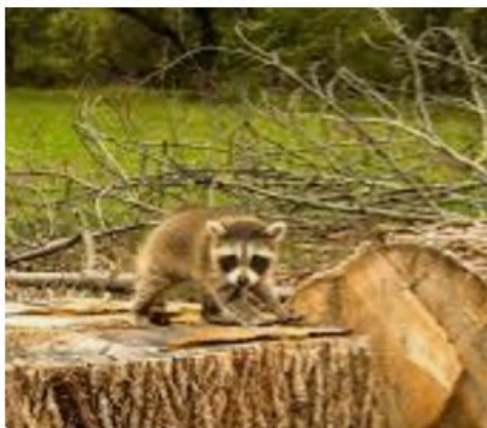
Carols Corner Changing the World One story at a Time

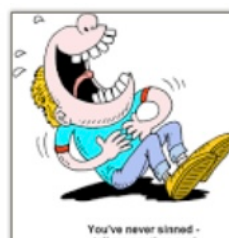

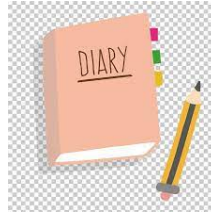
