

Easy Rum Balls

l pkt mixed fruit (depending on size of cherries cut cherries, might need to cut them smaller)

1 extra pk cherries cut into quarters Soak in rum for at least 2 hours

450g or 2 plain sponges from supermarket crumbled to fine sand.

Add 1 tin condensed milk

Sift in 3-tab cocoa

Add 1 cup desiccated coconut – will need extra for coating
Add soaked mixed fruit.
