Information Corner – Have you considered writing your Childhood Memories? We all have unique experiences throughout our lives. Recalling some of your childhood memories can be good to keep the brain functioning by remembering happy times. What can you write about? Start with headings and write a paragraph or two. Don't try to put things in chronological order as that makes the job too hard. Here are some headings to get you started.

- **Transport**. Did your family have a car? What was it? Can you recall catching a tram or train to school, or did you walk or ride a bicycle.
- **School**. What can you remember about school? Nowadays kids use backpacks but what did you take your lunch to school in? What did you have for lunch at school? Can you remember drinking a quart bottle of milk at morning recess?
- **Family**. How many siblings did you have? Was there a "naughty one"? What games did you play to amuse yourself, backyard water fights, board games?
- **Environment**. How did you cope without air conditioning? Can you remember sleeping outside on the lawn? Did you sit around an open fireplace in winter to keep warm?
- Other headings could include Home Deliveries by the Baker, Milkman, Paperman, Iceman, Entertainment, listening to the radio, cartoons at the cinema, playing in the street, Streetscape, Stobie Poles, Trees, Flowers grown by your family and neighbours, Food simple meals of chump chops, sausages, mashed potato, but no pizza, pasta or sourdough bread, Clothes no designer labels, often clothes previously worn by friends or older siblings, Birds sparrows, starlings, and blackbirds (these 3 now rarely seen), doves, fowls in the backyard, Guy Fawkes Night Penny bombs, Skyrockets, Catherine Wheels, Washing Day, Pets, Fruit and Almond trees, Christmas presents, Mum and Dad, Shopping. As you write more headings will come to mind.
