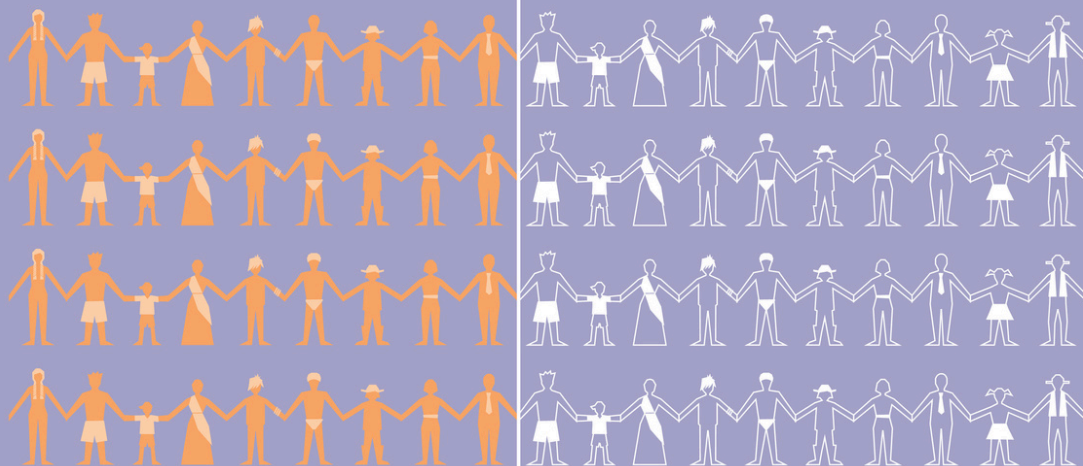

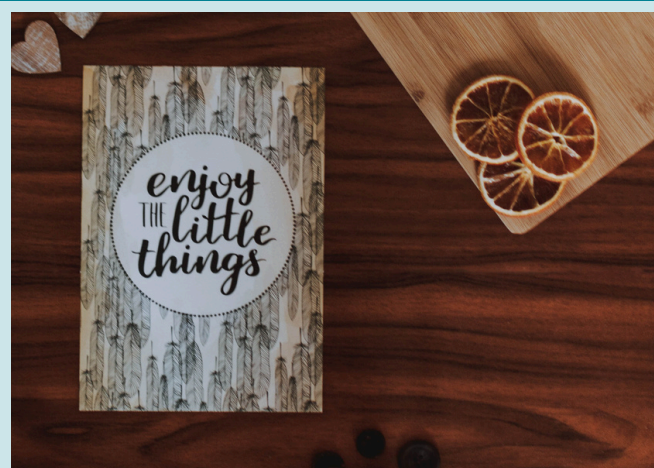

National advocacy update



Cash Mandate: A 'baby step' forward

National Seniors Australia (NSA) has cautiously welcomed new Federal Government regulations requiring fuel and grocery retailers to accept cash from 1 January 2026. The rules apply to in-person transactions of \$500 or less between 7am and 9pm, helping ensure people who rely on cash can continue paying for essentials. Small businesses with annual turnover under \$10 million will generally be exempt. Consumers can also continue paying bills in cash through Australia Post outlets. While the changes are positive, NSA says the reforms are limited and should be closely monitored. NSA is calling for stronger action, including measures to maintain access to cash, particularly in regional and remote communities. Keep Cash stickers are available from your branch.
