BRIFF ITINFRARY

Sunday 19 April: Meet at Greensborough at 7.30am for 8am departure.

Make a stop for morning tea from the bus at Marong. Drive via Wedderburn to Wycheproof for a picnic lunch. Stop at Nullawil Silo & Sea Lake to Mildura.

Check in to the Inlander Motor Inn with dinner in-house.

Monday 20 April: This morning visit the Mildura Botanical Gardens and hop on the tractor/train for a guided tour of the property. See the wonderful rose garden, hectares of flora. At Wentworth visit the Gaol & The Museum before a visit to Langtree Hall, Mildura's first public hall built in 1889 with an important link in Mildura's Heritage. See the great display of historical memorabilia, large collection of international dolls, christening gowns, toys, clothing, embroideries, and an old musical instrument collection.

Tuesday 21 April: Woodsies Gem Shop is first stop where a fascinating display will take your breath away. Next enjoy a morning Paddlesteamer Cruise along the Murray River. After time for lunch, visit Rio Vista Historic House - first occupied by WB Chaffey and his family in 1892. Rio Vista was designed as a large family home in domestic Queen Anne style and stayed a family home until the 1950s. The Art Gallery has various exhibitions. Wednesday 22 April: Today we visit Orangeworld. Enjoy the banter of 'Mario' as he takes you on a tractor trailer ride around the property, after which his wife 'Maria' will serve orange cake and a cuppa. Leaving Mildura we drive via Robinvale to Andrew Peace Winery en route to Swan Hill. Check-in to the Jane Eliza Motor Inn with dinner in the RSL next door. Thursday 23 April: After breakfast visit the Catalina Flying Boat Museum and hear about the services provided during wartime. See the nearby silo artwork followed by time at the Pioneer Settlement including a PYAP Cruise along the Murray. After dinner this evening enjoy the spectacular Light & Sound Show 'Heartbeat of the Murray'.

Friday 24 April: Checking out of the motel, we depart and make a stop for morning tea at Serpentine before continuing to The Great Stupa in Bendigo. Time for lunch at Maldon before the final journey back to Greensborough with ETA 5pm.
