<u>Apple & Grape Harvest Festival Coach Trip</u> 6-9th March 2020

With the inclement weather about, the over forty Gladstone National Seniors who went on the Apple and Grape Festival Coach Tour were fortunate to not have it deter them at all. It was lovely to see the countryside everywhere so green and lush. It was raining when we left from the Big W Bus stop at 5.45am on Friday 6th March. The first day was mostly travel but we took in breakfast at Gin Gin, lunch at Nanango RSL and the Black Forest Hill Cuckoo Clock Centre at Cabarlah. After a long drive we arrived at the Coachman Inn Warwick, where we were accommodated for the next three nights.

On the second day we departed Warwick and headed for the Queen Mary Falls. From here we did an overland track to bring us back to the outskirts of Stanthorpe to visit Kents Saddlery, the family business of Lyle and Helen Kent. This was one of the highlights of our tour as the Kents were generous hosts telling us about their factory where they make custom made saddles and leather, vinyl and canvas products.

About lunch time we travelled into the Stanthorpe CBD which had come to life with the Apple and Grape Festival spilling out over the streets and parklands. The area was crammed with entertainment, music, food and general market stalls and there was much to see (& eat).
