Presidents Report

We will be low on numbers for the March meeting due to a clash of dates with Probus, disappointing but we will soldier on. For those N.S members not in attendance, please make sure you check the social calendar and notify the coordinators if you wish to attend any social activities in March.

Everyone, please note, the date change to our bus trip to Cervantes to Monday 7th of April. We have 6 spaces left on the bus to fill before I open the outing to friends.

This month was the BNF meeting that unfortunately I was not able to attend. Ross Glossop and Karen Furnivall from Head Office attended the meeting and gratefully, I have their presentations to share with you at our March meeting.

In short there was apparently a significant amount of discussion around the closing of branches and the following alternatives were discussed.

- Transition to a Social Branch
- Merge with Another Branch
- Establish Regional Branch Committees to oversee social groups
- Incentives to Recruit Branch Executives

We may need to consider one of these alternatives at the end of the year.

These are the current wins that National Seniors has been able to negotiate for us over the past 6 months

- NSA's Cash Campaign: the treasurer introduced the cash mandate scheduled to commence in January 2026 to ensure that essential services and stores to still accept cash, graciously.
- The 12 months freeze on deeming rates until 30 June 2025 ensured pension payments did not reduce as inflation rises. This extended the two-year phrase that was ending on June 30, 2024.

• There was an increase in rent assistance which helped half a million people age 50+ who were recipients of the Commonwealth rent assistance scheme.

• \$500 a year in assistance rebate provided with household energy bills

The government has provided a \$140 million package that will expand facilities, deliver more aged care beds, improve health outcomes for older Western Australians and alleviate pressure on the State's health system. This package will enable providers to deliver more aged care beds across the State by providing funding to expand existing facilities and refurbish unused facilities to bring them back online.

The Royal Australian College of GPs has welcomed a new program in Western Australian to fund a scheme where General Practitioners can access outcomes and advice from five medical specialties. Potential specialty areas from which GPs will be able to access advice include: immunology; pediatrics; respiratory medicine; spinal surgery; and geriatrics. The medical specialists will advise GPs on their patients' management and health issues, via phone or secure message. The GP can then take over the management of these issues at the local level. This will save patients time and stress and provide more treatment for complex issues with their usual GP. Patients will no longer have to wait weeks for follow up treatment or expensive financial outlays.


Do NOT combine payments for multiple functions, only pay for one function at a time.
