PAMELA'S RECOMMENDATION

Pamela belongs to a Book Club. The following book was read and discussed "Tuesdays With Morrie" It's twenty years old, so many may have already read it, but if they haven't, then I'd recommend it. It's a true story about a university Professor who's visited by one of his past students every Tuesday while he is dying. It's a horrible condition which attacks the nervous system and comes under different names; Gehrig and / or Motor Neurone Disease, and / or Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis. He was a philosophical person and when he was asked about his past, present and future condition. He replied, "You have to find what's good, true and beautiful in your life, as it is now." In other words, you can't dwell on the past, or worry about the future, you need to make the most of this moment. I thought we could all learn from that. When the past student said he didn't know what to do in the future Morrie said, "Devote yourself to loving others, to your community around you, and work on creating something which gives you purpose and meaning."



Some News Items from National Seniors that you may have missed Campaign wins!

Energy affordability

National Seniors opposed the proposal to scrap the Energy Supplement for new pensioners. The government has pledged not to pursue this policy. Now, we're advocating to reinstate indexation of the Energy Supplement to help pensioners with energy cost increases.

We've also been advocating for a regulated price for electricity. Subsequently, the ACCC recommended creating a default market offer with a regulated price and basic consumer protections. Both major parties have agreed to this, and it is expected to start from 1 July 2019.

Fix pension poverty



National Seniors called for an increase in the amount of money you can earn without affecting the pension as part of its 2018-19 Budget submission. Subsequently, the federal government announced an increase to the Work Bonus in the Budget. It also announced an extension of eligibility to the self-employed.

The Pensions Loan Scheme will be extended to everyone of pension age from 1 July 2019. This includes an increase in the allowable income to 150 per cent of the Age Pension. National Seniors supports allowing older Australians using the equity in their home to remain in their own home.

Better quality aged care



As part of the 2018 Budget, it was announced that 14,000 new high-level home care places would be released over two years. National Seniors has been calling for more high-level packages to meet the high demand for these services.

The Pensions Loan Scheme will be extended to everyone of pension age from 1 July 2019. This includes an increase in the allowable income to 150 per cent of the Age Pension. National Seniors supports allowing older Australians using the equity in their home to remain in their own home.

In September 2018, the federal government announced the Royal Commission into the aged care sector. National Seniors has long raised issues about the quality of care in both residential and home care and we welcomed the announcement as a powerful way to improve this important service area for seniors and their families.

Franking credits



The federal Opposition reversed its plans to stop pensioners from receiving refunds of excess franking credits after National Seniors and others raised concerns about this in the media.

We are fighting for the same reversal to apply to self-funded retirees.

At the ready is a Bluetooth keyboard he can use with both the iPad and his Notebook, and an iPhone (used mostly for emergency calls or when he needs a taxi).

Micky's love affair with things technical began when he was just a lad. He'd started work with Queensland Railways at age 14 and began helping a friend who built and repaired radios for a living.

Micky bought his first computer, a Vic20, in the early 1980s to ensure he could keep up with his grandchildren. Soon, he was their go-to person for technical questions. He even taught himself to write programs, by reading the instruction manual.

Micky credits his lifelong interest in problem-solving for his ability to stay across the latest technology.




