

Glen Kenneth Moore

25th September 1946 — 10th March 2021



Glen was our inaugural President and served in the role for the first five years of our branch. He then remained on our Committee for a period after this. Gradually, his appearances at meetings declined but he would often surprise us by turning up on significant occasions such as AGMs and special anniversaries. A few years ago, when the position remained stubbornly vacant, he even put up his hand to be Vice President.

Glen spent his formative years in India. By the time he was 20, he was in Australia and was conscripted in the birthday ballot to serve in the army for two years. This was during the time of the Vietnam War and Glen saw service in the medical corps.

Following his discharge from the army, Glen joined the WA Police and served with them until his retirement in 2001. Some years before retirement, Glen attained the rank of Sergeant and went on to serve as a Prosecuting Sergeant in the Courts.

Sadly, Glen died suddenly on 10 March, at the young age of 74. He left behind five children and 11 grandchildren and his partner of the past 12 years, Vicki Sheppard.

Glen made a valuable contribution to our branch, especially in its earlier years. He was

an affable fellow and was well liked by those of us who were fortunate to know him.

Recycling Information

What to do with your metal container lids

We're all used to recycling our used containers these days, but when it comes to the lids, things get a bit more complicated. Here is some information about what you can do with metal container lids.

Metal lids from glass containers

Metal twist caps from glass jars, such as your pasta sauce, salsa or jams can be recycled, but separately from the container. Simply ensure that all food-residue has been removed from the lid and then pop it straight into the recycling bin.

Metal lids from food cans

Rinse the can and put into your recycling bin. You can put it inside the can and squeeze closed. The lid must be made of the same material as the can (aluminium or steel).

What about metal bottle caps?

Metal bottle caps such as those on beer and glass soft drink bottles can also be recycled. However, they are quite small and either slip through in the sorting process or have the potential to jam the recycling plant machines. The best way to recycle them is to keep a collection of them until you have a few and then put them inside another container made of the same material (such as a tin can made of steel or aluminium) and squash them closed so the small lids don't fall out.

Tip: To check what type of material a lid is made of, use a magnet. A magnet will stick to steel, but not to aluminium.
