PBS PRESCRIPTIONS and MEDICAL THRESHOLD

In the 2022 Federal Budget speech the Treasurer announced that the threshold would be reduced. However, he did not provide any details. I also found a press release put out by the Health Minister and again, while he referred to a reduction in the threshold, he did not provide any details. I have now found the following information on the internet.

As of July 1, the <u>PBS safety net threshold will be reduced</u> to \$244.80 (down from \$326.40) for concession card holders and \$1,457.10 (down from \$1,542.10) for general patients.

While the PBS threshold has been reduced the government has increased the threshold for out-of-pocket medical costs.
