### PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS SCHEME

The Morrison Government has delivered on its election commitment, significantly lowering the threshold for the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS) Safety Net from 1 January 2020. This means more than 1.6 million concessional and general patients will get earlier access each year to free or significantly cheaper PBS medicines. The PBS Safety Net eases the financial burden on Australians who spend significant amounts on PBS medicines, such as people with chronic conditions. Once people reach the safety net threshold, they can apply to get free or discounted PBS medications for the remainder of the calendar year.

The safety net thresholds have been lowered from:  □ \$390.00 to \$316.80 for concessional patients.
$\square$ \$1550.70 to \$1486.80 for general patients.

The changes mean concessional patients will need to get 12 fewer PBS scripts filled in a year in order to reach the PBS Safety Net, and two fewer scripts for general patients.

## RENTAL ASSISTANCE

Are you missing out on rental assistance when you may have an entitlement?

You can get Rent Assistance if you pay rent and you're either:

- getting certain payments from the Department of Human Services e.g. Age Pension
- getting more than the base rate of <u>Family Tax Benefit</u>.

You must also pay 1 of the following:

- rent
- fees in a retirement village
- lodging
- board and lodging
  - site or mooring fees if your main home is a caravan, relocatable home or a boat.

You must pay more than a certain amount of rent each fortnight. <u>How much Rent Assistance you can get</u> depends on how much rent you pay.

If you're living in a retirement village

Using the amount you paid when you entered the retirement village we assess if you're either, a:

- home owner
- non-home owner.

If you're assessed as a non-home owner you may get Rent Assistance. We base the assistance on your ongoing fees in the retirement village.

If you are not getting rent assistance and you think you may be entitled to it then I would recommend that you contact the Department of Human Services (Centrelink)
