## MEMBER'S PROFILE (by Mayleen Green and her mother, Norma Suttie).

Carrying on from our National Senior's Member Profile (courtesy Tony & Jenny Olive in March edition) of their experience on their wedding day on 26<sup>th</sup> January 1974, this is my mother, Norma Suttie's story and my story about that day also – the Brisbane Flood.

It was from a day in December 1973 that my life changed. I had been selected as an Exchange Student on a Scholarship to USA for 12 months through St. Peter's Lutheran College and then Kenmore Rotary. The country town I stayed in, Ironwood Michigan, was so kind to me and interested in me, my family, my life and Australia. I learnt and experienced so much.

#### But then -

2 weeks on from my arrival in America, 26<sup>th</sup> January 1974, was the Australia Day floods. The Council had organized for Bill Lickis, MLA, to get an army duck and people to go out to Moggill to take food and check on stranded people. My dad, Glenn Suttie, was in Kenmore Rotary and volunteered to help with 6 others. We had a farm at Moggill and dad had lived in the area all his life, so could tell the soldiers where to go by the tops of trees, buildings and power lines, as all landmarks were under feet of water.

Unfortunately the boat hit a cut loose power line and in a metal boat all the volunteers and rescued people in the front of the boat were in serious trouble. One man died and one went blind. Dad was floating in the water when a doctor recognized him, saw him moving, and rescued him. So he was alive and lived another 43 years. His plastic protective helmet melted on to his neck and ears and his arm holding the boat was burnt. So all his fingers swelled up like bananas (full of water) and he was in hospital for weeks with the burns.

I was in the USA and mum could not tell me about the accident as there was no communication out of Brisbane. She was worried I would see it on American TV, without knowing the details about dad. She also had to run our business at Kenmore and keep visiting dad. She couldn't leave the shop. Our staff couldn't get through, so my uncle came out to help.

It was a nightmare for mum. As I said, it went on for weeks.

She contacted me eventually and said not come home, so I stayed till the following January, 1975. Dad met me at the airport. It had been a horrendous 26 January, but it could have been worse for us.
