

Branch Refund Policy

Cancellation of an outing

The branch policy for late cancellations. Notify the Secretary or Treasurer 48 hours beforehand. A Medical Certificate will be required to receive a refund if notification is 24 hours or less. In the case of a <u>sudden</u> medical emergency on the day which cannot be prevented, the Management Committee will consider the matter with respect to a refund.

When we have to book seats on a bus or give numbers for a booked luncheon and are still required to pay even in the case of a cancellation by a member a refund will not be provided. In the event of an activity/outing being cancelled due to some unforeseen circumstance beyond our control, eg: storm, transport breakdown, etc, and cannot be rescheduled, members will be refunded any monies paid.



GALLIPOLI NURSES
