THE BRANCH NETWORK FORUM HOSTED AN NSA WORKSHOP ON MONDAY 11 MARCH 2024 – REPORT FROM THE WORKSHOP

Terry Flanagan, Terry Quinn, and Adolph de Sousa attended the Workshop representing our Branch. In addition, Rod Maclaren attended as a PAG representative. The workshop was delivered by Chris Grice the CEO of NSA and Karen Furnivall, Community Engagement Officer. They outlined all the major projects they were pursuing on behalf of all seniors throughout Australia. They are well informed of the issues by an advocacy and research team. Current issues are pension poverty; rising cost of living, healthcare; aged care, fairness in retirement income and Cashless society trends.

The NSA has negotiated with a number of companies for **member discounts**. Other important services tailored for Seniors include **Financial Advice** and consultancy, **Travel**, **Insurance** and **Financial products** such as attractive Government guaranteed Term Deposits. These operations not only save you money but also fund the research of NSA thereby ensuring the independence of findings. The research branch prepares submissions for each of the States and the Commonwealth in time for the shaping of Government budgets.

The NSA delivers to your mailboxes a *Connect* Online Newsletter, a quarterly online *Our Generation Magazine* which is accompanied by a hard copies of **Branching Out** mini magazine.
