

PRESENTATION BY GEOFFREY THOMAS ON AUGUST 8TH

For those wishing to obtain a copy of Geoff's original powerpoint, please text Terry, but be warned it is a large file, ~20MB. The following is a synopsis of this talk by our member Colette Nathan:-

Attendees were treated to an informative and entertaining presentation by Geoffrey Thomas, aviation journalist extraordinaire. Geoffrey titled his session "MH370 – Travel Chaos – The Truth".


He began with the question "Where is MH370, a plane containing 239 passengers that disappeared from radar on 8 March 2014?




Geoffrey said that while many theories still exist, current thinking is that pilot suicide was the likely cause by the chief officer locking the cabin door, depressurising the plane which would have anaesthetised all the other crew and passengers, then flying the plane until it ran out of fuel. He showed satellite records which indicated that the plane entered the Indian Ocean approximately 2000kms northwest of Perth. The last recorded radar ping being registered 6 hours after takeoff from Kuala Lumpur enroute to Beijing.

Geoffrey addressed some of the theories recently aired on a Netflix series, such as

- "a proper co-ordinated search was not initiated until 10 days later due to confusion and political obfuscation"
- "the debris field was not searched for 20 days". Authentic debris has been found by 14 people in 27 locations over 7 countries, especially in South Africa, but no debris has been found in the South China Sea. Geoffrey believes that the wreckage of MH370 will be located soon by the use of the 78 metre robotic vessels fitted with unmanned vehicles to explore a selected area of the ocean floor





Our aviation journey then shifted to the future of air travel when Geoffrey presented "Airline chaos – the facts!!" In 2020 the airline industry lost 25 years of growth due to COVID restriction

- 1. Covid layoffs -46 million direct and indirect
- 2. Covid sickness 30% absenteeism
- 3. Impacts all airline suppliers as well
- 4. Industry has lost \$300B in two years
- 5. Governments have flip-flopped on borders
- 6. Appalling weather-huge delays
- 7. Yes Qantas received \$2 billion half to keep network going and balance to support some staff
- 8. If all staff to be kept on -\$12 billion
- 9. Lufthansa received \$15 billion
- 10. Many Qantas competitors are government owned

Geoffrey related that he had actually been banned "at times" due to his opinions by Qantas

Geoffrey then extended his presentation by addressing an oft repeated claim that our aviation travel contributes negatively to climate change. Basically, the aviation industry worldwide has made fuel efficiency gain of 82% since 1960 and is tracking to reduce CO2 emissions to 15% according to market based measures.



SPECIAL CONCERT AUGUST 31ST

Our music guru, Joseph, presented another concert by UWA morning Conservatorium students and associates, headed by Maestro Ryan Lee on violin. They all performed most professionally and won generous applause and praise from the 91+ audience for works by Strauss, Tchaikovsky and Mozart. Your editor's favourites were the andante cantabile movement from Tchaikovsky String Quartet and Ryan's rendition of the cadenza in the Mozart violin concerto.

It is interesting to note that most of the performers also play with WAYO and several are doing other degrees, eg in biomedical science. Joseph will present another *magnus opus* later in the year.

AT THE MOVIES

Marion and Terry viewed the movie Oppenheimer, at the Luna, Leederville during August. It is a gripping, suspense-filled epic directed by Christopher Nolan and starring Cillian Murphy as J Robert Oppenheimer, a brilliant physicist who played the leading part in the invention of the atomic bomb during WW II. It is largely factually based, delving into his background and education and becoming involved romantically with two women who flirted with the incipient socialist movement in the 1930's.

The 3 hour film keeps you on edge throughout no less leading up to the first test in the Nevada desert when Oppenheimer admitted that in theory, a chain reaction could be set in place that would set on fire the whole atmosphere. At the end of the war he was subjected to a sham trial for alleged Soviet sympathies that could lead to them acquiring the bomb.

DISCOVERING ANCIENT EGYPT

Marion and Terry also visited, in August, Boola Bardip (Perth Museum) to view this special exhibition of artifacts from the Riksmuseum van Oudheden and University of Leiden of the Netherlands. It is a truly spectacular collection and well worth the \$17.50 admission. The only minor issue is that Terry had difficulty synchronising his audio (free) device with the walk – a bit dyslectic that way.
