From Slave to Patron Saint of Ireland

Captivity & slavery focused Patrick's faith & led him to convert the whole island. Yet, he was humble, as we read in his 'Confessions,' — "I, Patrick, am a sinner, the most uncultured & smallest among all the faithful, indeed many people consider me to be worthless." Patrick was born in Britain & lived on a small estate that once housed Roman legions. The son of a Catholic deacon, he did not take his faith seriously until his sixteenth birthday, when Irish slavers captured him, & shipped him off to Eire.

Patrick saw his captivity as God converting his heart. While tending sheep, he prayed ceaselessly. Then, after six years Patrick heard a voice in a dream tell him he would return to his country. Then the voice said his ship was ready.

So Patrick ran away, knowing he faced death if captured. But with God directing his path, he says he made the journey without fear. Patrick returned home, where he was received "like a son." His kin & friends hoped he would never leave. Yet, years later, God pulled his heart & his thoughts back to Ireland.

In a dream he heard, "We implore you, O holy boy, to come here & be with us."

Patrick returned to Ireland only in his forties or fifties, as he was "uncultured" & "uneducated." His formal education ceased when captured, & he had yet to become a priest & then a bishop capable of carrying out his grand mission.

A high chief heard of Patrick & sent him a magnificent copper cauldron. When his man returned, he asked how Patrick reacted to the precious gift. The man replied that Patrick said simply, "Thanks be to God!" The chief felt slighted that Patrick had not thanked him, told his man to go take the cauldron back. Patrick's response? "Thanks be to God!"

The chief decided that a man who thanked God whether a great good was given or taken away was a man he wanted to meet. They met. Patrick introduced him & his people to Christ.

Here is an excerpt from Patrick's "Breastplate," inspired by his love of Christ & the words of Isaiah 60:1.

Christ with me,

Christ before me,

Christ behind me,

Christ in me,

Christ beneath me,

Christ above me,

Christ on my right,

Christ on my left,

<u>Topic: "From Penang to Perth"</u>

Dr. Christine Choo, is a historian, social worker, researcher and author. Her address is titled, "From Penang to Perth". Christine will share reflections on her journey from Penang, Malaysia to Australia and to Perth. When her parents decided to migrate to Australia in 1967, she came reluctantly. But things changed. She writes, "In the process, I moved from training and graduating as a social worker, to becoming a social researcher and an historian with special interest in Western Australian history, particularly the contribution of indigenous people, migrants, missions and minority groups."

In addition to social work qualifications, Christine focused on "Adoption practices in Australia" for a Master's degree and in 1996 a UWA doctorate entitled "Aboriginal Women on Catholic Missions in the Kimberley, Western Australia."

Jasmyn Hutin, External Affairs & Communications Manager, Orana House. She speaks to the important work of Orana House in creating a community free from domestic violence.

"The four representatives from PROST - an exercise support group of the Prostate Cancer Foundation of Australia Inc. provided a comprehensive outline of the prostate disease from an experiential point of view. Not only did they mention the process leading to the procedure or surgery but also the post operative recovery process involved so that men can ultimately aim to achieve a preoperative condition and attitude to life.

Jeff Leach is a pharmacist and a property developer, chairman of the JJ Leach Group and founding member of the PropTech Hub. As the current chairman of PROST he spoke of his work with the health and social issues dear to his heart. **Vian Botma**, and **Zac Prince** are exercise physiologists who have worked with a wide variety of demographic exercises in the right way. They use **exercise as medicine** to recovery. **Ross Campbell** spoke of the program itself for men with prostate cancer and the need for a considered post treatment plan. PROST provides gym sessions and social gatherings which enable participants to connect with other men in their area who are dealing with prostate cancer."

Dear Members and Friends of National Seniors Perth Branch

At yesterday's meeting of the National Seniors, Terry Quinn, our Branch Network Forum (BNF) representative explained that the BNF had cleared the request from the WA based researcher for the Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme (a Monash University Research project).

The WA based Researcher's name is **Natalie Wray** and she wrote to us seeking participants for their national study, whose lead researcher is, **Dr Barbara Barbosa Neves**, Survey Co-lead and Lead Investigator, in the School of Social Sciences at Monash University. The study has been cleared by the Human and Research Ethics Committee of Monash University. The aim is to inform Government on policy issues related to these services.

It was explained that Natalie Wray required a minimum of **50** persons to participate in the study from WA and so far she had about 17. If you are involved in an Aged Care package or is a person caring for an aged care person you might be interested in contacting Natalie directly.
