

Brisbane City Council have partnered with BlockTexx to provide Brisbane residents with an opportunity to recycle their unwanted household linen for free via Give a Sheet® for the Planet. These drive-through events

allow residents to drop-off their household linen in a quick and easy manner and are a fun way to get involved in a local recycling solution for end-of-life textiles.

Items that can be recycled include all household linens that are made from cotton, polyester and cellulosic fibres (including viscose, rayon, bamboo, linen and tencel). These valuable textiles are then recycled into new raw materials to be re-manufactured.

The 2 remaining dates are **Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> Sep** at Karawatha Forest Discovery Centre, Karawatha, and **Saturday 21 October** at Boondall Entertainment Centre, Boondall.

David Bailey is an Australian theatre organist, composer and silent film accompanist based in Brisbane with a musical style influenced heavily by the popular music of the early to mid-twentieth century. A theatre organist firstly, David's main form of musical expression has always been connected



to the silent film world, but in 2007 he brought this expertise back to the cinema and pursued an interest in silent film accompaniment.

David Bailey offers a cinema experience both novel and nostalgic. 'For Heaven's Sake' will be screened with organ accompaniment.



# Tues19<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER 12:00pm to 1:00pm - Nonsemble.

Nonsemble inhabit a space between contemporary classical and adventurous pop music, resulting in a diverse output that ranges from sprawling and evocative modern compositions to meticulously crafted chamber-pop. A septet consisting of piano, string quartet, drums and guitar

(plus the occasional blast of electronics), the group's musical backgrounds are as varied as their output: classically trained instrumentalists, seasoned rock players, and electronic tinkerers, whose musical interests range from obscure electronica and instrumental math-rock to early baroque music. This unique setup and blend of influences provides for a wide palette of sounds. Olafur Arnalds-esque lushness meets Joanna Newsom jubilance, while the shimmering brightness of minimalist composers such as Steve Reich and John Adams rubs shoulders with the intensity of Godspeed You Black Emperor or 65daysofstatic. Nonsemble have a penchant for the rhythmically complex, but theirs is a music where the heart always wins—often in spite of heavy doses of heady conceptualism.

### Tue 26th SEPTEMBER 12:00pm to 1:00pm – Tyrone and Lesley.

Tyrone and Lesley are an award-winning ukulele and double bass duo who write light music for dark times. Having one foot on the theatre stage and the other on the music stage is a striking stance which has seen them headline for audiences little and large all the way from the Sydney Opera House to the United Kingdom. With many recordings released, they've brightened many rooms from Adelaide, Sydney, Melbourne, Auckland, Newcastle, to Cairns and Kenilworth and are thrilled to share their songs at City Hall.


