An Independent Pension Tribunal to set the deeming rate?

Last week there was another interest rate cut and talk of more to come. That's bad news for anyone with a savings account, and doubly so for those being assessed for aged pension eligibility.

While actual rates have dropped like a stone, 'deemed rates' have remained fixed. And it's those rates – set at 3.25% for assets above \$51,800 and 1.75% below that figure – which affect the amount of pension you receive. It's time this absurdity - this inequitable, punitive situation - was addressed. Because don't we all wish we were achieving 3.25% interest on our savings? When Treasurer, Josh Frydenberg, demands that the banks pass on the full interest-rate cut, he should be embarrassed by Government's failure to take the same equitable approach in-house.

The deeming rate tracked alongside the reserve bank cash rate from 1997 up until about 2010. It was either the same as, or slightly below, the cash rate. Then in March 2010, that all changed; there was a clear policy decision to place the deeming rate above the cash rate. It's time to reverse that appalling decision. The last time the deeming rate was lowered was back in March 2015 when Scott Morrison was the Social Services Minister.

Since then we've witnessed a 1.25% drop, with pundits expecting more to come.

Good and bad – Home Care packages update

The latest release of the Australian Government's home care packages waitlist has revealed the queue has grown. There are now more than 129,000 older Australians waiting for subsidised home care.

However, the rate of demand outstripping supply has slowed, which could be explained by additional packages announced last year, coming on stream.

National Seniors continues to press the Morrison Government to do more to meet demand and stop the situation where at-risk people, who qualify for a package are dying or moving into aged care facilities before getting care support
