SCIENCE CORNER

What was Einstein Thinking?

Einstein loved puzzles – he loved to prove that logical explanations and scientifically correct equations could lead to conundrums that required fresh interpretations to solve what appeared to be contradictions.

But before we go into this, we have to understand one concept first. Thank the stars it's just one concept. After all, we're talking Einstein here.

Doppler. He was German scientist who explained why it was that when a train hoots when it is approaching that it sounds different to when it is leaving you. The frequency of the sound waves change. Same with light. As the light approaches an observer the frequency increase and when it departs the frequency decreases. When a star approaches it emits blue light. When it leaves it emits red light. Same light - different effects.

Uses of the Doppler Effect: When you look at very very distant galaxies, their light is red. The universe is expanding. They are moving away



from us. The Doppler effect has been used to discover 442 of the 473 of the planets so far discovered outside of the solar system. Planets – not stars – so this is a big deal here.

The effect is used in heart valve diagnoses to detect vascular irregularities as the blood surges towards and then away.

It's used in speed traps as well...... Shire finances owe a lot to Mr Doppler!

Ok, so back to Einstein.

Now suppose we are in a vacuum and there is a stationary source of light. It is not moving. It is emitting light in two directions, left and right. Now we all know that the energy emitted left and right must be the same. All good, easy, relax, no worries.

Now suppose you as an observer climb into a picture frame. This frame moves. It moves left and right. Now suppose you move towards the light – blue waves. And then you move away from the light – red waves. Doppler effect kicks in. In the case of the observer – from his point of view - the energy emitted by the light is not the same.

So now the conundrum Einstein solved.

The laws of conservation of physics state that in a closed system, energy, mass and momentum cannot change. They are interchangeable, but the total cannot change.

However, from the point of view of the observer the energy coming was different to the energy going. If mass, momentum and energy had to all add up to be exactly the same, something had to give. Einstein calculated that what changed was the momentum of the light source. The light source would have had to recoil ever so slightly in order that the laws of conservation remain in place. And momentum is mass x velocity.

So, from the point of view of the observer, there was a change in momentum. And since the light source did not move, the only thing that could have change was mass.

Expressed like this: Change in energy = change in (mass multiplied by the speed of light squared). Simplified: $E = MC^2$ Clever fellow!

THE MEN WHO KILLED THE NEWS"

Author Eric Beecher. Published Simon & Schuster, Australia (2024) - 416 pages

This book by Eric Beecher is a fascinating analysis of what is wrong with the news media and newspapers today. Beecher is well qualified to comment as he has been a News Corp and Fairfax editor and also an editor of Crikey, and Australian independent news website whose mantra is "tell the truth and shame the devil". He has worked for Rupert Murdoch and sued by him, unsuccessfully.

The answer to the question is of course the newspaper moguls who have manipulated the news to amass wealth, influence politicians and distort democracy. From Randolph Hearst in the USA and Lord Beaverbrook in the UK, to Conrad Black and Rupert Murdoch in more recent times. Misinformation and Fake News are now a fact of life. So, Elon Musk and Al are also analysed.

Beecher's book is an excellent read for anyone with an inquisitive mind as we learn how the moguls operate and what we need to be aware of as we peruse the newspapers and dissect news media in today's world.
