

STS LEEUWIN II – UPDATE by crew & maintenance volunteer Derek Cockle

You may recall from many press and TV articles that sail training ship Leeuwin, moored in her usual berth against the wharf in Fremantle Harbour, was badly damaged by an out of control very large container ship in the early hours of Friday 29 August.

Whilst all three masts, spars, rigging and most sails were destroyed, fortunately the hull was not damaged. The debris was removed from the ship a few weeks later, but there was a long delay whilst insurance companies and lawyers tried to determine who was responsible and who should pay for the major repairs.

The ship was eventually motored down to Henderson and dry docked in October for just over three months whilst the ship was repaired and new steel lower masts installed. At the same time the opportunity was taken to carry out other major internal works, including removal and overhaul of engines and generators, installation of new refrigeration and air conditioning plant, new water tanks and complete external repainting and antifouling.



At long last the ship returned to Fremantle Harbour on Thurs 23 Oct so that rebuilding can be completed.

It is hoped to recommence day & evening public sails and youth voyages in late January and I will advise when information is available.

BOOK REVIEW – "THE BOOKSELLER AT THE END OF THE WORLD" by Ruth Shaw published by Allen & Unwin, New Zealand (2022). 320 pages ISBN 9781988547756

Ruth Shaw has written an interesting memoir about her adventurous life and her wee bookshop in Manapouri, Fiordland in the South Island of New Zealand.

The many and varied jobs Ruth undertakes leaves one's head spinning. She joined the WRENS and may have been the first in New Zealand to go AWOL (absent without leave) after serving two and half years and eventually discharged. She cooked for priests in Wellington, crewed the sailing boats and yachts and was held up by pirates in the Pacific. Her time spent as a cook in Papua & New Guinea and working with drug addicts in King's Cross in Sydney attest to her amazing adventurous spirit.

Ruth's various travels and occupations are often escapes from trauma in her relationships, but she never admits to this or wallows in selfpity. Her story is interspersed with descriptions of the characters she meets in her wee



bookshop and her love of people and books shine through.

You will love this book which portrays a woman who lives her life to the full and finds love and happiness with her first love who she meets again many years later. One can only admire Ruth's courage to write such a heartfelt memoir.
