Report on February National Seniors Council Meeting

National Seniors Council and the Board met in early February to discuss strategic issues impacting on the over 50's. Topics discussed included membership, marketing, commercial services and advocacy. There was also some discussion on the upcoming federal government election. Below are summaries of two items of business.

CEO Prof John McCallum opened the meeting with an overview of our current positioning statement which reinforces our advocacy position and the provision of quality services leading to more informed decision making by older Australians. There was considerable discussion on the success or otherwise of this positioning statement, how it should be measured and where are the future opportunities for business and services.

Specific discussion centred on the Aged Care Royal Commission and National Seniors role in promoting the many issues surrounding aged care in Australia. Through research and feedback from members many of the problems in the aged care sector are related to the provision of quality services such as patient to carer ratios, qualified staff, 7/24 nursing care and support, effective handling of complaints, patient hygiene and elder abuse.

Although, it was recognised that many aged care homes are good facilities some fall well short of an acceptable level of care.

Prof McCallum, who was one of the first to be interviewed by the Aged Care Royal Commission will discuss the issues raised by members. I spoke on the possibility of National Seniors becoming the administrator of the aged care quality unit or at the very least having a more proactive role in monitoring the quality of aged care. We will no doubt hear of the outcomes in due course.

Overall a productive meeting and a good opportunity to network with other members. John Urquhart
