Notes of the Monthly Meeting held at C.ex Coffs, Vernon St. Coffs Harbour Wednesday 13th March 2019

President Pete opened the meeting at 11.00 am. The Guest Speaker, Solicitor, Manny Wood had limited time to cover "Where There's a Will, there's a Way" and invited members to ask questions throughout his presentation. Manny was awarded Specialist Accreditation in Wills and Estates and, after firmly advising that this session was NOT to be taken as legal advice, presented descriptions of some essential legal documents and processes.

Power of Attorney: The Authority to act on your behalf in Financial matters while you are alive. More than ONE Attorney can be appointed. Joint bank accounts can be activated without a power of attorney.

Enduring Power of Attorney: Needs a Solicitor to action. Must be signed by yourself and the named Attorney. Manny explained that there have been some instances - but not many - where an attorney has taken more care of themselves than following the best interest of the one for whom they are acting. Therefore, the attorney chosen should be a trusted person. Both *Power of Attorney* and *Enduring Power of Attorney* die with you.

At this stage Manny suggested that we, as a friendly looking group, should all look out for each other, and for other friends and relatives, and seek advice if it is thought that a friend is "being abused", physically or financially.

Enduring Guardianship: Covers Health related decisions, e.g. Medical procedures and medications; where to put you if you can't look after yourself; hen to "pull the plug", etc.. Enduring Guardianship HAS NOTHING TO DO WITH A WILL. This is an important document, especially if you do not have any next of kin.

Advance Health Care Directive: Manny is not keen on these and prefers Enduring Guardianship with the right person, so no real details on this one.

WILLS: THE MOST IMPORTANT DOCUMENT IF YOU DON'T WANT THE STATE TO GET ALL YOUR WELL-EARNED MONEY AND VALUED POSSESSIONS. MAKE SURE YOU HAVE ONE.

Outdated wills are apparently worse than no will. Update regularly, particularly if circumstances change. A Will <u>must</u> be signed by yourself in the presence of **two witnesses**. An Executor <u>must</u> be appointed to administer the estate. The Executor does not need to agree to be nominated but it is kinder to at least ask them. The Executor can also be a Beneficiary, (even the only one). Usually a Solicitor is contacted by the executor to guide them through the process of finalising the estate (at a cost, of course...). Probate is arranged by the Solicitor and that declares that the Will is valid. Superannuation has a binding nominee and does not form part of the will or go through probate.
