What a wonderful milestone Elvie reached on 13th October 2020. On Thursday NSA Gladstone Branch, arranged for plaque to be placed on their Centenarians Totem pole situated in Tondoon Botanical Gardens, also a tree to be planted in her honour. The family asked that the morning tea ceremony, normally held, be cancelled due to the Covid 19 virus. The Mayor, Matt Burnett, visited Elvie at New Auckland Place, where she now resides, and presented her with a beautiful bouquet of flowers and congratulatory card.

Elvie was raised in Calliope by her parents Annie and Dave Aldous along with four brothers. One brother Eric is still living in Gladstone. She had a happy contented childhood, and later trained as a nurse, which she gave up to marry Cyril (Sardy) Brown.

They had known each other since schooldays. Elvie's father built them a house on Taragoola Road and in the 1960's they moved to Sunny Hills, a farm which belonged to Elvie's Grandparents, Tom and Lucy Wright, there they tended the farm and milked cows, and stayed until retirement.

Elvie & Cyril had five daughters, a total of six grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Elvie was widowed in 1998 but stayed on the farm for a while, before moving into Calliope, then eventually to New Auckland Place.

NSA Gladstone commenced this ceremony in 2000, at the present time over 30 plaques are in place on the Totem Pole.

Centenarians usually receive a Celebratory Card from The Queen, Prime Minister, Governor General, Qld Premier, Ministers' and local dignitaries.
