• Chris Grice spoke to us about the various aspects of the National Seniors website, mentioning in particular the branch intranet which he considered was under used. I believe we use the Intranet to advertise and to put up our newsletter each month, thank you to Joe for managing this for us. We have had several people who have found our newsletter on the National Seniors Website intranet and whom, have since become members.

• He mentioned the benefits of using National Seniors Travel Agency and Travel Insurance which is discounted at 10% for all members.

• He introduced us to the Concessions Calculator which is also part of the overall framework.

• Ian Henschke spoke to us about the Royal Commission into Aged Care. Information is available on the website. He seemed to think that they were making improvements in leaps and bounds.

• The Eduation Officer from the Senior Housing Advisory centre spoke to us about the implications of downsizing from the large family home to smaller accommodation. There's plenty of information and booklets available from their website. They are even available for one on one consultations if required. • June McDonald from the Policy Advisory Group (PAG)spoke to us about the role of this particular group and asked if anyone was keen on joining but it was quite a time commitment. Information from the PAG emails forms part of my Presidents Report in the Newsletter and at the general meetings. Issues that were

brought up were Seniors car parking at all shopping centres and a program called Bins for Blokes which bought our attention to the fact that women have bins in their toilet cubicles but men's cubicles do not. This is particularly inconvenient for those men who need to dispose of incontinence articles.

• Speakers from the Public Transport Authority provided us with a fascinating presentation on how the Thornleigh to airport underground tunnel was built. This line, from the city is due to open in April 2022 apparently.

#### Aged Care Planning

National Seniors Research has revealed the following:-

14% of older Australians have prepared financially for their aged care. 38% had considered about aged care costs Future aged care planning was higher amongst those of higher education and greater wealth. These figures are alarmingly low for Australians preparing for a comfortable later life. Something for us all to think about in the coming years.

#### **Pfizer Vaccine Available**

People aged 60 and above can now visit http://www.rollup.wa.gov.au to register and book an appointment for the Pfizer vaccine at a State-run COVID-19 vaccination clinic. There are currently 50,000 appointments available across WA Health State-run COVID-19 vaccination clinics within the next six weeks.

IF YOU ARE NOT enrolled in Medicare – phone 1800 653 809 (Australian Immunisation Register)

Alison Morland found the lady on the end of the phone very efficient, personable and helpful. Your letter will arrive after 10 days. You get all your Immunisations listed, dated and the vaccine named.

There is a special piece at the top of the list stating (in Bold) Covid-19 Immunisation Status (and a big tick)

## This individual has received all required COVID-19 vaccinations.

And that piece of information can be folded back to be shown by itself, should you not wish the official to see the rest of the page.
