## **President's Report**

My sincere appreciation in all those who have supported us during the last month in coming forward to serve on the Committee. There are still places where we need a lot of help. First, we need a Vice President. The role involves acting for the President while that person is away. Second, we need someone to take over the editorial role for this newsletter and someone to help us each month with the layout and design. The Brisbane Office has been great help since April, but they expect us to handle these things as is the case with most Branches. Third, we need someone to be the welfare person for our members. This involves just checking on the health of our members and applying the RUOK principle espoused in this month's words of wisdom.



The other branches have also been a great help to us. The Perth Western suburbs branch will assist is with a Planning Workshop next month which we hope will revitalise our Branch. We will use the experiences of the Port Macquarie Branch. The Port Macquarie branch was dissolved in 2004 and reopened in the following year. Through the leadership of one of its past Presidents it conducted a planning exercise and has worked through the strategies that came out of the exercise. As a result, today the branch has over 140 members and they meet every second Tuesday of the month at the Golf Club. Their past President is now a member on the Board of the National Seniors Australia and in September will be visiting Western Australia with his partner and they hope to meet with the Presidents and Treasurers of each Branch on Monday 23 September where they will share their experiences.

Since taking Office, my executive has been busy with the paperwork associated with the changing of the Office Bearers. We have to meet the legal requirement under the various legislative provisions of the State and Commonwealth. As an incorporated Association the State Department of Consumer Affairs is required to have our Audited Financial report and the information on the new Office Bearers. The ATO has oversight of the ABN and Tax File Number. Finally, a copy of our AGM Minutes along with our AGM reports has to be sent to our Brisbane headquarters and our signatories to our bank account have had to be changed.

### 2. Guest Speaker: Jasmine and colleagues: Friday 1 November 2024

A Presentation of the Story of the men and women who founded the Aboriginal Evangelical Fellowship (AEF) of Australia from an Aboriginal Perspective.

Australian indigenous people have very long lasting and rich oral traditions concerning their cultural, religious, social and economic life. The traditions include stories, education and rituals passed down from generation to generation and kept alive by important social gatherings and festivals. Dr Maxine Knapp is a Noongar woman from Western Australia who has provided a written account of the origin and growth of one such story, the indigenous Christian Church called the Aboriginal Evangelical

Fellowship (AEF).

Maxine's daughter, Jasmine, along with colleagues will speak about her mother's written account, including the social and political background and the importance of all Australians knowing and understanding the nation's Aboriginal Heritage. Maxine is happy for a Q&A discussion after her talk.

**Brief Description**: Cycling Without Age connects people unable to ride themselves, with their community and outdoors by giving them rides on trishaw eBikes, piloted by volunteer cyclists. The interaction of passengers, pilots and the community promotes inclusivity, reduces social isolation and makes passengers feel valued.

National Seniors has partnered with this nonprofit group to enable our members and guests to take rides on that day.

Please bring your own flask of Coffee/tea and sandwiches which you can share at the picnic tables at the site. There are two trishaws with the capacity of two in each. They will give you a half hour ride through the park by the river along the cycle way and dual footpath and explain to you the flora and fauna to be seen in this vicinity. At the end you are expected to give an anonymous donation in a box that will be placed by the organisers. You are expected to give within your means but generally a minimum contribution of \$10.00 is expected. National Seniors as an organisation is expected to give the organisation a sum of money. All these funds go to support the project and the maintenance of the equipment and training of the volunteers.

We will finish at around 11.30 depending on numbers that participate. After that we will go to a restaurant for lunch which you will pay on the menu of your choice.



## **Reports**

### REPORT ON THE PANEL DISCUSSION ON THE EVERALD COMPTON COMMUNITY SERVICE MEDAL

Judith Bartlett led a conversation on the Everald Compton Community Service medal. Everald Compton is a remarkable man who lives in Queensland and came from humble beginnings and always devoted his time for those whose needs were greater than his own. He is the founding father of the National Seniors and the NSA has created a medal in his name to recognise long standing and outstanding contribution to the Australian community while celebrating everyday champions who are "turning grey into gold" with grassroot experiences and selfless contributions that make a significant difference in their communities.

Judith emphasised that that there are many heroes in our local community and cited the life of Christine Choo who came here reluctantly with her parents from Penang and finally landing up studying and being a main social worker for the Aboriginal community. Her PhD has been published into a book and shows her ongoing commitment to the indigenous people.

Judith invited Carmen de Sousa to share her experiences in Australia having migrated from East Africa more than 50 years ago. Carmen shared her experience with starting up a literacy program for adult Aboriginals in a Shenton Park church and because of its success it was taken over by the TAFE and offered through Fremantle TAFE in the initial year and finally in brand new premises at Thornlie TAFE. She explained that these were the most rewarding years of her life as a result of which not only did Thornlie TAFE get an award but she herself received the Outstanding teacher of the Year for her work in the program.

Curtis Clarke explained a little bit of his own background and how he had met Everald Compton at one of the State Conferences of the NSA in Perth


